



When a Member Falls Ill or Passes Away

The following is important information to help guide NYSTRS members and their loved ones through difficult times.

Active Member

◆ **If an active member with at least 10 years of NYS service credit* is critically ill or facing a significant surgery:**

The member may file for disability protection. See our video “Filing for Disability Protection: What you Need to Know” on the Benefits > Disability Retirement page at NYSTRS.org. The member may file a disability retirement application:

- a. Online using their MyNYSTRS account (notary not needed); OR
- b. By completing and filing pages 1, 2 and 7 of the *Disability Retirement Application Package*, available on the Forms page at NYSTRS.org (application may be faxed; notary needed).

If the member passes away from the condition noted on the disability retirement application, the beneficiary(ies) may receive the Largest Non-Declining Lump Sum benefit and 50% of the member’s Paragraph 2 Death Benefit. This is typically more than the beneficiary would receive for an In-Service Death Benefit.

◆ **If an active member passes away**:**

Please notify NYSTRS by calling (800) 348-7298, Ext. 6110.

The member’s named beneficiary(ies) will receive the eligible member’s In-Service Death Benefit and the member’s contributions balance.

Retired Member

◆ **If a retired member passes away**:**

The beneficiary should call NYSTRS at (800) 348-7298, Ext. 6140 to report the death. This will ensure the beneficiary(ies) receives any promised benefits in a timely manner. An original or certified copy of the death certificate will need to be submitted to NYSTRS. The beneficiary should also contact the retiree’s:

- Former employer, which may have provided health insurance.
- Applicable union to collect on life insurance policy(ies) that might be in effect.

Power of Attorney

Active and retired members may authorize an agent to act on their behalf regarding NYSTRS benefit transactions (e.g., filing for retirement or disability protection).

- Members who already have a properly executed Power of Attorney document may submit it to NYSTRS’ Legal Department at the address shown below for review.
- Members who do not have a Power of Attorney may use NYSTRS’ *Special Durable Power of Attorney Form*, available on the Forms page at NYSTRS.org.

**The service requirement is waived if the disability resulted from an accident sustained in the performance of the member’s teaching duties.*

***Funeral directors typically report deaths to the Social Security Administration. However, next of kin should confirm notification occurred. If it did not, it is the family’s responsibility to do so.*

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
